### The Building Fund

While the wreckers are at work demolishing the old buildings on the site of the new Institute, we presume to present a complete statement of our financial situation.

We do this for the dual purpose of informing the society's friends and supporters of the generous contributions that make it our privilege and duty to go ahead, of advising them of the remnant still to be secured to complete the building fund; and of giving those who have subscribed an opportunity to correct any clerical errors that may have crept into our records. With many transcriptions of names, initials are easily omitted or perverted; family names are easily misspelled; and the intentions of the subscriber may be misinterpreted.

This latter error—or rather the possibility of it—is most disconcerting. A subscriber may forget that we cannot fathom his mental reservations and while he wishes to have his contribution applied to a definite end, such as a memorial room, we may—and natur-

ally enough, we will—deposit it in the general fund, unless the destination is specified.

In order, then, that our records may be made letter perfect, we request our subscribers to inform us of any clerical errors, if such there may be.

For purposes of convenience, separate records are kept of subscriptions to the general fund and of subscriptions for specific purposes.

### Memorial Rooms.

In the new Institute of this Society there will be several large rooms used by the different departments of the work. The cost of building and furnishing these rooms has been estimated and they are being reserved for those who wish to contribute large sums to the new building and have their gifts permanently memorialized, or who wish to memorialize friends and relatives by taking these rooms in their name. These rooms are distinct from the 500 memorial bedrooms reserved in the same manner for those who contribute \$100 each to the building fund. A list of the larger rooms is here appended:

SHIPPING BUREAU, about 35 feet square .....\$2,000

Employment was secured for 3,126 seamen, free of charge to them, through this department last year.

DINING ROOM, about 30 by 46 feet in size .....\$3,000

Where good meals will be served at reasonable prices to the seamen lodging in the Institute.

OFFICERS' DINING ROOM, 18 feet long; 32 feet wide.....\$1,000

To maintain discipline at sea separate accommodations must be provided for the officers and seamen in the Institute.

SAVINGS DEPARTMENT ...\$1,500

The seamen deposit their savings with us to the extent of \$120,000 annually.

SITTING ROOM, about 35 by 86 feet, with mezzanine floor.....\$10,000

CHAPEL, about 47 by 55 feet, 18-foot ceiling .....\$15,000

MAIN STAIRCASE, running from basement to fourth floor.....\$3,500

It introduces the seaman to the Institute and to the hospitality of the port.

The total cost of the land and building has hitherto been estimated at \$742,500. Until final estimates upon the completed plans and specifications are obtained, the *exact* cost cannot be given; but, to allow for all possible contingencies, the Building Committee have thought it best to raise the estimate for the cost of the land

and of the building *fully completed and furnished* to \$800,000.

The entire amount needed will not be secured until the remaining large rooms and memorial bedrooms have been subscribed for and contributions amounting to \$175,000 have been added to the General Fund. We confidently expect the churches to contribute the \$6,190 required to complete the Chapel Fund. That the memorial bedrooms will be taken as fast as they are brought to the attention of those who wish to memorialize their friends we cannot doubt; others, certainly, will select the remaining large rooms. To those friends whose contributions must be made in smaller amounts, the General Fund extends an invitation to give.

#### O. Egerton Schmidt.

During the past month the Institute has lost one of its old friends and supporters, Mr. O. Egerton Schmidt, whose death we report with deep regret. Mr. Schmidt was elected a member of the board of managers in 1890 and became Chairman of the Executive Committee at the annual meeting, held on April 16, 1895. He continued in that office until December 12, 1905, when he was made Vice-President, resigning from the Board of Managers in 1909. He was then elected an honorary member, a position that he occupied at the time of his death.

Mr. Schmidt proved his deep interest in the welfare of the Society by his activities. Many pleasant and helpful experiences are recalled by the Superintendent and those who have been engaged in the work. Further evidence of Mr. Schmidt's interest in the Institute is his bequest of \$5,000 left to it by his will.
