In the evening, I was visited at my house by an Irish family, a mother and two daughters by the name of Mc Cart, who arrived yesterday in a company of 9 persons, on the ship Isaac Meble from a port bound tomorrow to his cousin's dwelling in a town. They were intelligent people. A P. M.
